

New Department of Labor Guidance for Employer Compliance with Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA)

The U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) released updated guidance for employers to comply with new requirements under FFCRA. DOL offers a number of plain-language compliance assistance materials to explain FFCRA's benefits and requirements. Tools include a <u>Fact Sheet for Employees</u> and a <u>Fact Sheet for Employers</u>, available in both English and Spanish, and an expansive list of <u>Questions and Answers</u> addressing the questions WHD has most frequently received from stakeholders to date.

U.S. Political Activity

Additional Funds for Loan Program?

After passing a \$2 trillion relief package for small business relief, legislators are discovering that the \$350 billion in funds for the Paycheck Protection Program are quickly being depleted. Congress is working to pass an additional bill (being referred to as "3.5") to add an addition \$250 billion in funds for the small business lending program. However, the bill failed in the Senate yesterday. Speaker Nancy Pelosi and Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer said they wanted to add money for hospitals and state and local governments. The Trump Administration was opposed to that offer, and preferred Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell pass the bill without it.

Individual Stimulus Checks

The U.S. Treasury is expected to begin the process of direct deposits to individual bank accounts starting today. People without direct deposit set up will begin receiving paper checks next month. <u>Read more</u>.
